Gleaming Star	Less than 100 employees and demonstrates a culture of safety and health both on site and in the community	Less than 100 employees and demonstrates a culture of safety and health both on site and in the community

In June 2023, the Agency will announce the Safety Award Recipients. Companies that are selected will be contacted using the information provided on the application. Award Recipients will be honored with a certificate and publicly recognized.
